## **The Era of Mercury Free Restorations : Bonded Semi Crowns/Inlays and Onlays**

Patient's demand for a more aesthetic and also possibly healthier dental material will drive the demand for composites, ceramic and ceramic reinforced resin materials. - Understand and see the step by step process of the preparation and bonding techniques for a bonded ceramic/ceramic reinforced resin restorations.
